Thank you so much for sharing your "Precious Pet," Enzo, with us.





SELECTING YOUR WALL COLORS design. decor. details

Marya Flurnoy is a local Interior Designer and lectures on "Enhance the Space."

Designer Tips for Selecting Paint Colors:

- 1. Palette—Start with a reference piece that has most of your colors—from a pillow fabric to a piece of art, or lamp. For your neutral background color, hold your paint deck to the piece and pull out the most probable color. It does not have to be exact. If you are adding a feature color, again select the color from the accent piece and match to your paint deck.
- 2. Lighting—I recommend having your designer or paint store order poster-sized paint samples. Gone are the days of putting pints of paint on the walls. Now you can tape the paint poster to several areas. Notice how the wall color changes from daytime to night, and in different areas of the room. This tip will determine which paint color you prefer. Wall colors will always change with different lighting.
- **3. Greige**—If you are going with grey tones, I recommend using a greige color in large open spaces. This color comes from mixing grey and beige, which feels soothing and warm. One of my favorites is Benjamin Moore Revere Pewter HC-172.
- **4. Finally, be brave and have fun!** Always select accessories that you love. The art of great Interior Design is, "There are no rules today. The only important aspect is your Intention of the feeling you want to create."

New Trend in Cruising TRAVELING IN A GROUP



There are times that someone faces life-changing events. A diagnosis of cancer, a loss from a job due to illness, a disability. In an instant, life can bring catastrophic challenges we must face, and our basic needs force us to reach out for a helping hand. This is where Women With Purpose steps in; by helping others in times of tragedies, it allows them to focus on healing and recovery.

My name is Jane Morse Swett and for over 20 years, I worked with oncology patients. The last five years, we operated a foundation that helped patients with non-medical financial assistance. When a new company came in and re-organized the entire process of cancer protocol, it was very difficult and upsetting, especially when people whom I had worked with for years, were told, "We no longer need your services." I stayed with them for one and a half years, dreading to go to work. The stress was causing one eye to twitch, I was gaining weight and my blood pressure was going crazy. So, I quit.

After several weeks at home and wondering what I was going to do, I had my Oprah "a-ha moment" and decided that I would start my own foundation, with the same mission of helping cancer families with non-medical financial assistance. We pay patients' rent, mortgages, utilities, car insurance, car payments and repairs.

Since 2011, Women with Purpose has been helping our community by keeping patients in their homes, with their food and bills paid. 97% of your donation stays in our county, only 3% is used for clerical...no one makes any salary!

Many of our patients may or may not have insurance, and regardless, they still must pay household bills. That's difficult to do if you are only living with social security payments. Or if you are a single parent with young children and no one to help you.

Below are a few testimonials from patients that Jane and her group of committed community people have helped:



Hi, Jane, we haven't spoken in a while, I hope you still remember me.

Last year I applied for funds to help me pay my bills and I was approved. Also, you, yourself, helped me tremendously with bills and Christmas cards for my kids.

I wanted to get in touch with you and ask for help once more. I am not a person to ask, I have never, in the past, but as life throws you in many directions, you don't have a choice. I am embarrassed in a sense, but I don't know where to turn. Bills are piling up and it's hard for me to keep up.

Since we have spoken last, I got better, got back on my feet for a couple of months and then I fainted at home. I went to the ER and was informed that my breast cancer had now traveled, from my breast to my lungs, and to a spot in my brain. They wanted to do immediate brain surgery. After being in the hospital for four days and discussing it with my doctor, I decided to try radiation first. I am still hopeful and pray to God that I will live for a bit longer. I am a positive person, or at least I try to be. Please keep in touch if you can.

CDR WOODY HUDDLESTON,

USN (RET) OF DRIFTWOOD LANE

Turns 102



We had the honor to meet and talk with Veteran Woodrow (Woody) Huddleston, coincidentally on his 102nd birthday.

We discovered that he had a wonderful personal story and we wanted to share some of the most interesting highlights of Woody's life with you.

Woody was born in Dublin, Mississippi, on June 24, 1917, a town that no longer exists. His mom became seriously ill and died when Woody was only 3 years old, leaving his father, John, to raise Woody, his brother John Jr., and sister Gertrude as a single parent.

FATHER, GRANDFATHER AND NEIGHBOR

John held a prestigious job in Dublin as the supervisor of a thriving cotton plantation, overseeing the productivity of the entire operation. At this time, the plantation served as the main source of providing the material to make military uniforms for WWI. Because this role was essential to the war effort, it could not be eliminated.



so John was exempt from the draft. John ran one of the largest and most productive cotton plantations, because, according to Woody, "He was kind to the farmworkers and treated them respectfully."

When Woody was four years old, John moved his family to Sorento, Illinois, to be close to his family so they could help with the caring of his three children. John found immediate employment as a Blacksmith. And fortunately, Woody's aunt was a first-grade teacher, so she was able to get Woody into school at a younger age than most first graders.

At a young age, Woody accidentally made a discovery that led to what would someday be his career. He remembers seeing Charles Lindbergh, the American aviator known for making the first non-stop flight across the Atlantic Ocean in 1927.

One day, soon after Lindbergh's historic flight, Woody decided to work on an old radio as a hobby. With his skills and curiosity, he got the radio working and was able to listen to the live broadcast of KMOX radio station. He was one of the first to hear about the Lindbergh crash in New Jersey. It was during this time that Woody realized he was good at building electronics and wanted to attend high school to learn more.

John, however, did not share this excitement and refused to let Woody enroll in high school. Woody was determined that he was going to get an education. He left home and moved into an abandoned hotel in Sorento, to pursue his next chapter in life.

Woody told *HBL* that he survived by getting a job carrying coal for a local widow for 40 cents a day. He would carry three buckets a day so she could heat her stove. This gave him just enough to purchase a can of beans for his food.

When Woody graduated high school in 1935, he moved to Chicago to attend Coyne Electrical School for six months.

In 1936, Woody joined the U.S. Navy and was sent to Great Lakes, Illinois, for boot camp. Looking back on his life, Woody said that the old saying "everything happens for a reason" seemed to fit this part of his journey.

One day during boot camp, Woody had some free time off from performing drills or marching practice. He decided to go up in the barracks attic and look around. He discovered a light and realized that this was where the Navy performed their signaling operations. No one was aware that Woody had friends that worked at the



railroad. Their job was to switch the train track lanes to keep the trains moving smoothly, safely and productively. Just for fun, these friends had taught Woody the Morse Code.

While Woody was up in the attic, he pointed the light down on the new recruits, who were practicing their marches, and he signaled, "Are there any HAMS down there?" (a HAM is an amateur radio operator that can send messages to other amateur radio stations). Just as Woody sent this message, his Petty Officer sneaked up on him and asked if he knew Morse Code and started punching the keys to quiz him on his knowledge. Woody translated the message immediately and shocked his Petty Officer. This tricky situation got Woody promoted to study radio school in San Diego. He was an active HAM well into his 90s.

One fond memory of Woody's experience was going to Honolulu on the *USS Langley*, the first U.S. Navy's aircraft carrier and first turbo-electric powered ship.

In late 1936, Woody was stationed in Pearl Harbor on the *USS Oglala* for four years. He was the Lead Radio Field Signaler, relaying messages to all the other ships in the harbor.




Woody, now Chief Petty Officer, oversaw all communications between the radio stations in Honolulu and the high-speed circuits to Washington, D.C. Woody was also the Superintendent of the mid-watch night shift before the attack on Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941. Fortunately, at the time of the attack, he was on an outlying island, setting up a special antenna.

One Saturday night in 1946, Fannie Severino, a career bank teller from Akron, Ohio, was vacationing with a girlfriend, in Corpus Christi, Texas. They were eating dinner at a local spot when Fannie caught the eye of Woody Huddleston. As Woody dined alone, he was contemplating how he could "accidentally" run into this nice-looking lady. After the girls finished dinner, Woody approached them, and they had a long conversation.

Fannie, being a devout Catholic, invited Woody to attend a Catholic Sunday Mass for his first time, on the following day. He gladly accepted the invitation and three days later, Woody proposed to Fannie. She accepted his

crazy offer, went back home to Ohio, retired from her bank-teller position, returned to Texas and they were married three months later. Fannie Huddleston was now a Navy wife and ready to start her new adventure. It was truly a case of "love at first sight." And the two love birds were married for 72 years.

The newlywed couple was anxious to start a family. And over the years, they had five wonderful children together. Their oldest child, Franceen, was born in 1947 in Providence, RI. The next two children were born in San Diego, California: Jim in 1950 and Elaine in 1954. Marcia was next in 1955, born in Great Lakes, Illinois, and baby Jennifer in 1958, when the family lived in Jacksonville, Florida.

Woody loved to travel by plane and he always wanted to learn to fly planes. It was a passion he could not get out of his heart. The Navy helped him fulfill this dream. He decided it was time to learn, so he applied for it, and was sent to attend preflight school in Athens, Georgia, where he graduated from the Naval Aviator School. He spent most of WWII as a flight



instructor in Pensacola, Florida and other naval stations. During this time, he became a Naval Officer and flew for more than 20 years. Although he was a pilot during WWII, Woody was not directly in the war zone. He developed weapons in Washington, D.C., for three years and later in his career, oversaw a group called Carrier-Based Airborne Tactical Data Systems.

During his long career, Woody had many assignments and promotions. He became the Director of the Electronics Office, working directly with Dr. Werner Von Braun in recommending the English Direction Finder.



This recommendation became instrumental, several years later, when Woody was the commander of a P2V7 patrol plane tasked with locating the monkey, Ham, in the rocket firing experiment from Cape Canaveral to the Bahamas. This experiment launched and lasted eight seconds longer than planned, which landed Ham 450 miles off course. Ham was found safe and healthy but was just a bit unhappy.

While Woody's career was flourishing, Fannie began employment with Southland Corporation, in Virginia, after their children started school, and eventually transferred to Florida,

serving almost 20 years in the financial management offices.

In 1966, after 30 years of service, Woody decided to retire from the ranking of Commander, U.S. Navy. He wanted to find a permanent home for his family, in an affordable area with no severe weather. The Huddleston family settled in Harbor Bluffs on Driftwood Lane and have been here ever since.

After being in the Navy for all those years, Woody wanted a boat of his own. He purchased one while the family was still living in the Virginia/D.C. area. The family boated from Virginia to Florida where they were able to dock in their back yard on the Intracoastal on several occasions. They also valued their weekend getaways on the boat. This very outdoorsy family told HBL of the great times they had boating or camping together.

Woody was still quite a young man when he moved to Florida and eventually went to work for the City of St. Petersburg in their Communications Department, where he served for 20 years in various roles.

Fannie always loved music and the theater. As a child, she taught herself to play the piano and enjoyed entertaining family and friends. She sang in the choir of St. Patrick's Catholic Church for thirty years.

Their children are all grown now with extended families. Franceen is a doctor of psychology; Jim is retired from a local grocery store chain; Elaine works for Pasco County Public Schools; Marcia is a doctor of public health/epidemiology; and Jennifer is a hairdresser in Texas. Woody and Fannie have eight grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren

During their long marriage, the couple loved to cruise and went all around the world: Alaska, Italy, South America and all over the Mediterranean.

On May 18, 2019, Fannie, age 96, the Huddleston family matriarch, died, with the family lovingly gathered around her at Largo Medical Center.

We asked Woody to please tell us their secret of being married for 72 years. He said, "Always speak your mind, be honest and don't hold things in."

HBL would like to thank Woody Huddleston for sharing his life experiences with us and with you.








It is so important to get breast exams and imaging to find a breast cancer. Here is a thoughtful reflection of Principles and Practical Tips to add to everyday life that can help us actually prevent breast cancer.

Vaping e-cigarettes appear to be much less toxic than traditional cigarettes; there are over 70 toxic substances in cigarettes. While probably a better alternative, vaping, does have formaldehyde as an off-gas of the process. So it's definitely better to skip smoking and vaping altogether!
- 4. To Hormone, or Not to Hormone. Often, we hear that hormones should be avoided. Yet we know there are many actual health benefits and quality of life things we want, like energy, libido and sleep. Even getting six hours of sleep at night has been shown to substantially reduce the risk of breast cancer - a tough feat for many women after menopause without hormonal support. The prudent choice would be to maximize

benefits and minimize risk. Use the very smallest dose in a way that your body can absorb, to get the best benefits. Natural bio-identical (just like our own) hormones by pellet or on the skin provide the most benefit. Through the skin, by cream or patch, gives a healthy approach, but requires a higher dose to get results; cream, pellets, vaginal rings or patches are the best approaches for our health. Pellets provide the most effective results, with the lowest dose, and deliver the results consistently over 90-120 days. A much lower dose of estrogen is given with pellets over other approaches. Also, surprisingly, testosterone pellets alone will often optimize our quality of life by stopping night sweats, restoring energy and reviving libido, and we can use a non-hormonal option like ThermiVa in the office to keep sex comfortable and fun.

- **5** Take DIM. Another way to help reduce our risk of breast cancer is by adding the dietary supplement (di-indol methane). DIM is the major bioactive indole in cruciferous vegetables (broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower, brussels sprouts and kale). Research shows that DIM helps us metabolize our estrogen to a safer pathway and helps protect against breast cancer. DIM is a naturally occurring supplement that has anti-cancer and immune-modulating properties to help prevent breast cancer. It is impossible to eat enough of these vegetables to get the amount of DIM you need, so a daily supplement provides it.
- 6.Keep Moving. One of the most important things we can do for our health!



It's a **Public Health Crisis** and an **American Epidemic**

Domestic violence is NOT just a women's issue, it is a public health crisis and an American epidemic. Domestic violence prevention education needs to be a TOP priority for our communities and lawmakers.

The economic costs, drain on our legal system and emotional damage to all affected residents and children cannot be understated. Due to lax punishments by some judges and prosecutors, abusers are walking free and violence is on the rise, terrorizing individuals and innocent children. This not only creates broken homes but devastatingly broken families striving to recover from the trauma, as well.

Through my volunteer work at Hands Across the Bay, I have seen the tear-filled eyes and broken heart of an elementary school teacher, who was sitting at the trial of the man who brutally beat and mutilated the body of one of her tiny students in a domestic violence attack. I also have witnessed first responders who cannot recover from arriving on the scene of a domestic violence murder or attempted murder. The brutality and memories of children in shock, if left alive or

wounded, standing as their innocence and childhood disappears.

I have seen mothers of abusers wale and cry as their son (in most cases) was lead off to prison as well as their FEAR and worry when justice is not done and they are let free to continue their violent rampage.

I have held the hand of multiple women who were set on fire, shot and stabbed, wondering if they can ever look in the mirror again or perform simple daily tasks. I've consoled the fa-

thers of daughters brutally murdered... as well as little boys who have witnessed their mothers raped and beaten in domestic violence-ridden homes.

I can't help but wonder what will they be like as they grow up thinking this is normal? What will they do when they are going to school with YOUR kids and run into your family in the parking lot of a grocery store? Law enforcement officers know domestic violence calls are the most dangerous type, which has been the tragic cause of fellow officers being killed in the line of duty.

We MUST show ZERO tolerance to ANY abuse and not wait till it is out of control before we act. Women can no longer be sitting ducks waiting to be killed while trying to leave an abuser. Leaving should NOT be a deadly decision, as we know staying is, as well.





1 T CINNAMON

I T NUTMEG

CAP YELLOW FOOD COLORING

2 1/2 CUPS SUGAR

1 CUP RAISINS
