

family focus As told by Phil Bayly

THE BAYLYS SOF HARBOR VIEW LANE

Phil Bayly first met Sue Rockhold as the paperboy in Harbor Oaks collecting for his delivery of the Clearwater Sun to the home her parents had just rented on arrival to the area. Phil initially presumed Sue was a new customer and the young Lady of the House until discovering she was his lipstick-wearing high school classmate at CHS. Their friendship followed but lost momentum until a few years later when they were in college.

Phil is a multi-generational Floridian with a heritage that traces back through the early pioneers of Pinellas County. His mother, Nan McMullen, was from the huge McMullen clan while his father, Cyril Bayly, was the youngest son of P.J. Bayly, founder of Baylys Bluffs,

(predecessor to Harbor Bluffs), a story we will be highlighting in another issue.

Sue moved to Florida during her youth with her parents, Dr. and Mrs. Luther Rockhold, and friend Dr. Snyder who moved from Missouri soon after WWII to open the Suncoast Hospital in Largo. Originally, their hospital was a converted large single story ranch house nearby on Indian Rocks Road.

Phil began his military career as a Marine in 1950, after completing high school in Clearwater. He left with short notice on a troop train going to California, as the country mobilized for the Korean War. His life since then never slowed down. After serving a year in the Marines, he entered the U.S. Naval Academy at Annapolis, MD. By then, Sue was attending Mary Washington College nearby in Virginia. They connected again more seriously and were engaged and married in 1955.

With graduation and his father's chagrin, Phil did not continue in his father's nostalgic Navy but selected the USAF for his officer's commission. He was a civil engineer until going to pilot training and becoming a pilot flying B-47s and B-52s in the western U.S.

Phil and Sue's children, Jim, Elizabeth, and Karen were born in 1958, 1962 and 1971 at the Suncoast Hospital in Largo during Phil and Sue's arranged returns for vacation and visits with their families locally. Their





first son John was killed in a tragic accident when he was a young child.

Phil's early attendance at Command & Staff College in 1965 residence distinctly marked him as a "Fast Burner" for future promotions and better assignments. The schooling in-residence at the Air University is equivalent to a civilian obtaining a master's degree in political science. The curriculum included seminars, special reading, and lectures from political and military VIPs, such as the Secretary of State and JCS Chairman.

Phil and family accompanied him to his assignment to Japan for four years. It was also his entry into the U.S. Intelligence Community with the mystique of the NSA and CIA's sensitivity of Intelligence Surveillance and Assessment. Phil's direct focus was on the Far East from Russia to SEA and he also flew related RC-130 missions with the required high level (SI) security clearances. He was a Major then, and gained in-depth insight and comprehension of U.S. International activities.

However, he could not discuss or share with Sue any of his involvement with the ongoing events and his interactions until years later. Instead, they and their kids fully enjoyed living in an exclusive military family community near Tokyo. They also took off-base excursions throughout Japan to better understand the people and culture. Sue also hosted a weekly group of Japanese college students from Tokyo University to learn English at their home on base. Phil coached Jim's on-base Little League sports and flew his model airplanes on weekends with American military and Japanese civilian modelers.

Phil's direct insight to the Pueblo and Navy EC-121 shoot-down incidents was extensive. He had been "The Man" for his entire tour from the flight line to the headquarters. More significant, the continuance of Air Force and Navy conducted Intelligence Surveillance internationally was suddenly in jeopardy. Accordingly, the JCS Chairman,

General Wheeler, secretly traveled to Japan to receive Phil's special one-on-one briefing in the U.S. Embassy in Tokyo. Policies governing military and political resolution between Field Operations and the Highest Level of Authority in Washington was the essential objective.

General Wheeler directed Phil on the spot to be the Special Project Officer with authority to close the gap between daily Operations and Washington's governing Directives. It included a major upgrade of the Command and Control Communications System. Phil's career and future assignments were rewarded immensely. Five years later, Phil was a full Colonel with possible stars ahead.

Phil continued on to Vietnam to 7AF & MACV Headquarters as the Senior USAF Counter Intelligence Officer. Sue, Jim, and Elizabeth returned to FL during this SEA tour and rewarded Phil on his return to the U.S. with their new daughter Karen for a new family addition. Karen now tells all

tion. Karen now tells all she "was made in Japan."

Phil's reward to Sue was their next assignment to CA. It was their favorite place to live and would become a reality again. He was promoted to Lieutenant Colonel and served as the One star Wing Commander's admin and flying Exec. He also assumed his first Command of a 650 man Aircraft Maintenance Squadron to support over 100 B-52 and C-135 tanker training missions a day. It was a big and demanding job.

meant deployments and visits to Area 51. This was the real stuff.

Phil's assignment to Air War College in residence cut his Agency job short and meant family relocation and another academic year in Alabama. It was similar to C & S, but more significant. It was for senior officers,

gon job was significant in establishing the guidelines for the first U.S. Delta Force for quick reaction worldwide; but, it and his future work expectations had all become too political, as expected. Maybe he had just flamed out and lost his inspiration and perspective with little true military left on his horizon. He didn't know if he would get the star or it would get him. Or maybe, was too much success possible? Regardless, he chose to stay the minimum of two years required time in grade to confirm his promotion before retirement. Gen. Jerry O'Malley (see below) and significant others strongly counseled Phil to do otherwise. Nonetheless, he left his military service and officer's commission with 28 years of total active duty and a Full Colonel, Command Pilot, with numerous awards and decorations to wrap up his personally rewarding life and distinguished military career.

was not good anywhere in the country with Jimmy Carter's stagflation running in high gear. But fortunately, Phil's retirement entitlements were already reasonable when he discovered the Honeywell Military Avionics Division in Clearwater was hiring a few engineers. Phil had never experienced unemployment before, but it was as if his name was on one of the Honeywell positions. He eased through the job interview and began work immediately. He also phased-in to the civilian corporate routine that seemed very similar to his earlier Air Force jobs. He and Honeywell realized he was a graduate engineer with extensive experience in their business of aircraft navigation system's operations and maintenance. He also had the prior working knowledge for the environment of high-level security clearances, and he could begin classified work immediately without company expense or delay. So, he immediately began working on several very secret contracts just stating up. Phil's prior Lockheed Skunk Works, stealth F-117 Program,

CIA and Area 51 experience was also a perfect fit. Few at Honeywell had either. Having already been there and done that earlier with the Agency's U-2 program, Phil showed he had more to offer Honeywell immediately than he or they ever expected. So, his promotions and pay increases came quickly too. He was home free without relocation hiding just around the corner, as it had always been before for his entire family. He just settled in and did a consciously good job in his new profession for 20 more years. And, he would facetiously tell his peers at work that he was only there on an athletic scholarship since he also coached and played on the company's


Phil also worked on Honeywell's new Nav System upgrade program for the B-52. Perfect; it was a plane Phil had flown and maintained in the Airforce with extensive knowledge. He soon became the "Go-To Guy" to resolve many of the irregular things that always emerge between the government and contractors, and Honeywell was no exception. Phil's earlier gained knowledge with USAF training on the government's complicated Depot-centered supply system was also gold. It was not a stressful job by comparison, and he never had any fear of failure. All continued well for 20 more years until Phil finally chose to fully retire in 1998.

It is now 20 years of retirement. Phil and Sue's children have all flown the nest and have good jobs locally, while Jim and Karen's children are grown, too. Elizabeth has no children but managed to get her master's degree a few years ago while working at Verizon on their FIOS Project. These experienced world travelers didn't get very far away from home once they settled in on the Gulf Coast, but surprisingly were all born at the Suncoast Hospital. Jim and Karen live in Largo, while Elizabeth is in Belleair.

Their advice for others is to keep a good sense of humor and don't hold a grudge through it all during the highs and lows.







Elizabeth went to Largo High School and Karen to Anona Elementary. Phil and Sue's network of prior local friends from their high school years also came together immediately. Everyone was happy. They were home at last.

It didn't take long, however, until Phil was promoted again. This prompted

was promoted again. This prompted his relocation and assignment as an O-6 to the JCS Special Operations Division in the Pentagon. The family needed to stay behind this time to further settle-in following the excessive turbulence and fragmentation they had all endured for too many years. Phil also became disillusioned commuting home too infrequently from D.C., and reluctantly decided it was time to bail out. His JCS-Penta-


Micro and Jasper are littermates. I found them, their mother and two other kittens at an abandoned duplex 10 years ago.

Ingredients

8 ounces milk chocolate chips 8 ounces white chocolate chips 2 tablespoons shortening 1 pound fresh strawberries with leaves

Direction

In a double boiler, melt the milk chocolate and I tablespoon shortening, stirring occasionally until smooth.

Gently grab strawberries by the green stem and dip the strawberries into the chocolate mixture.

Turn berries to evenly distribute the chocolate and gently place them on a sheet of wax paper. Retain a little of the mixture to use as a drizzle on the white chocolate berries.

Repeat above same steps for white chocolate mixture.

Once all berries are covered, drizzle the milk chocolate berries with the white chocolate mixture and the white chocolate mixture with the milk chocolate berries.
