












Family member names: Curt Treloar & Nancy Kuni

What do you like best about your pet? She has a really Biggg personality! (and did we mention cute?)





What organization do you volunteer with? I volunteer at the Pinellas County Animal Services (PCAS), located at 12450 Ulmerton Rd, Largo

How long have you been volunteering with this organization? I have been volunteering with PCAS for about one and a half years.

What types of tasks do you perform for this group? At the shelter, I wear a few hats! I'm a dog walker/adoption facilitator - in this role, I exercise the dogs by walking them, romping around in the play yards tossing balls and frisbees along with working with the dogs on proper commands. Our goal is to provide these often-forgotten fur pups with love, and to keep them socialized and cared for while they wait to be adopted! Since most of the dogs come to PCAS as strays, some have never felt a human touch, been walked on a leash or even had their basic needs provided. To see that dog come to us and watch the transformation into a sweet, loving, happy pup and, hopefully, on to their forever home keeps us motivated and inspired!

My secondary role is as a Mentor/Trainer. In this capacity, I provide hands-on training to new volunteers, ensure volunteers have what they need, like poop bags (LOL), throughout their shifts, direct volunteers to certain areas for proper coverage, and try to fill in on shifts where we are short staffed, which seems like all the time!

Additionally, I submit pictures and creative write-ups weekly to the Volunteer Coordinator for social media posts on PCAS FB page. About six months ago, another volunteer and I started our own Facebook page @dontforgetaboutmeshelterdogs. This page is dedicated to raising awareness and being a voice for our longtime shelter dogs. We spend many hours coming up with creative ways to highlight these overlooked dogs -dressing them up, creative posts, videos and anything else we can do to get them adopted. Over the last six months, we have had at least four successful adoptions from the page and we are still growing and reaching the residents of Pinellas County.

How many hours a week on average do you spend volunteering? Well, when I first started it was about four hours a week, but as my love and passion for these amazing dogs, especially the" Pitties," has grown beyond what my heart can even take some times, I'm there 15-18 hours a week! I worry about all of them all the time. We have had numbers of dogs go from only 40 to right now we have over 100!

How can others get involved with this organization? If you are up for a challenge, love dogs (or cats), need exercise and don't mind getting wet kisses and a little dirty, we are desperate for more volunteers! Animal Services Shelter and Adoption Center is a great, big place to work with a huge mission! We also have teen programs as well. 



Yia Yia's Secret Spanakopita (Spinach Pie)

A Greek Staple

resident recipe

Ingredients

4 - 10 oz bags of washed Baby Spinach

1 Lb. of Feta Cheese - Imported is best, but domestic is ok, too 16 oz Whole Milk Cottage Cheese

2 Package of Phyllo Dough (Publix frozen aisle)

2 Large Yellow or White Onion

1 bunch of Scallions (green onions)

6 large Eggs

1lb (4 Sticks) of Butter Olive oil can also be used

ltsp salt or to taste

ltsp pepper

Directions

Step 1

Remove Phyllo Dough from freezer 2-3 hours prior to cooking and leave unopened on the counter.

Step 2

You will need a very large mixing bowl to hand mix all of the ingredients.

Chop pre-washed Spinach, Onions, and Scallions into small pieces and add to the bowl.

Hand crumble the Feta Cheese into small crumbles and add to the bowl with the Cottage Cheese,

Eggs, Salt, and Pepper.

Hand mix lightly until thoroughly combined.

In a medium saucepan, melt 1lb of butter.

Step 3

Pre-heat oven to 350°

With a cooking brush lightly paint the bottom of a 13x9x2 in. pan (or the closest you have) with the melted butter, make sure to brush the sides also.

Carefully unroll the phyllo sheets and place them between two very lightly damp kitchen cloths.

Work fast because the dough dries out and becomes extremely brittle when dry. If the sheets rip or break don't worry no one is ever going to see it!

Line the pan bottom of the pan with 4 sheets of dough, buttering between each sheet.

Add 1/3 of the mixture, evenly distributing it over the dough. Add 4 phyllo sheets to completely cover the mixture again buttering between sheets.

Repeat mixture/dough process two more times.

Be sure to butter between all sheets

Butter the top sheets completely.

With a knife or fork poke a few holes in the pie to vent.

Cooking

Add pan to the middle rack and cook for 1 hour at 375° until golden brown.

Watch carefully, and if the top layers get too dark lay some tinfoil over the top to keep from burning

Let the pie thoroughly cool and solidify, then cut into squares and enjoy!



BELLEAIR RESIDENT FOUNDS NONPROFIT FOR SPECIAL NEEDS

Belleair resident, Robin Lally, has founded a nonprofit organization, Help Us Gather, or HUG, to advocate for inclusion and to connect individuals with disabilities to social events and activities.

Lally was inspired to start an organization focused on advocating for inclusion by her older brother, Rick Farr, who has autism. When Farr moved to the Tampa Bay area in 2015, finding medical care, housing and employment was straight-forward. The tough part of the transition was finding events and activities where social connections could be made. As a result, not uncommon to many people living with a disability, he was very lonely.

According to a report by Cornell University in 2016, nearly 1 in 7 Floridians have some type of disability. Lally decided to create HUG to provide a better way for individuals and families with special needs to connect.

HUG helps people with disabilities connect to the community in several different ways. First, it web-hosts a community calendar that lists and organizes hundreds of events and activities for



people with special needs all over Tampa Bay. When visiting www.helpusgather.org, a user can find a calendar full of things to do specifically for their age and needs.

In addition to the community calendar, HUG hosts an adult social group called "Friends of HUG". The group's events help foster friendships and create fun and positive memories. Outings have included an adaptive Pinellas



County Sheriff's Citizens Academy created specifically for HUG, a VIP day at the Clearwater Marine Aquarium and even a Rays game where a member of the group threw the first pitch!

With its community calendar and social group underway, Lally and her team are now going a step further by founding a new initiative to push for community inclusion. HUG is going door-to-door, talking to local businesses and organizations, and asking "How do you include?".

Robin Lally, founder of HUG, said, "We meet many individuals who are feeling so lonely and isolated that they come into the HUG office in tears. It is hard to see people feeling this sad, but as they connect to friends and activities over the following weeks and months, we are able to see them transform into happy people."



Many businesses and organizations are unaware of the simple changes they can make that will have a significant impact on the lives of community members and families with special needs.

Some examples of changes a business can make to be welcoming to those with disabilities are:

- Provide enough space for wheelchairs to easily maneuver
- Offer to turn up the lights or turn down the music
- Host sensory hours (a scheduled time when the noise and lights are controlled)
- Be prepared for hearing or visually impaired
- Train staff on successful ways to interact with individuals with special needs
- Offer a small discount

Every month HUG recognizes a local business or organization for their efforts of inclusion. The winner receives a full-page magazine ad reaching 2,900 homes that highlights their efforts, along with website, media and social media coverage.

Additionally, HUG has compiled an online database of inclusive Tampa Bay businesses and organizations. This free community resource is great for individuals, parents and/or

caregivers looking to find friendly, accepting and accommodating things to do around town.
