

sponsor spotlight

Bjorn Brunvand was born in Stavanger, Norway, in 1963. He grew up nearby in Randaberg, a small farming community with a population of about 4,000. His father was a local dentist and his mother was the first female mayor of his hometown. This was a safe and beautiful place to spend formative years despite the harsh climate.

In the summer of 1981, at the age of 17, Bjorn was lucky enough to arrive in Largo, Florida, to live with a new family as an AFS (American Field Services) foreign exchange student. Patricia and Jerry Dominick, as well as their youngest daughter Karen, became his American family, and remain so to this day. They lived in Harbor Bluffs, on the corner of Jacaranda Drive and Harborview Lane. He recalls waking up on day-one in Harbor Bluffs, experiencing heat and humidity that was unimaginable for a young Norwegian. His first activity that morning was to jog Harborview Lane to the Belleair Causeway, followed by a walk on the beach, a dip in the Gulf of Mexico, and his first sighting of the local dolphins swimming off Belleair Beach. While his residence in Harbor Bluffs was brief, the neighborhood remains a favorite.

At the age of 18, and only about four months after returning to Norway, his path led him back to our beautiful area. Bjorn made the permanent move to Pinellas County in December 1982. He obtained his education from St. Petersburg Junior College (St. Pete College), University of South Florida, St. Petersburg Campus, and Stetson University College of Law in Gulfport. In 1983, at the conclusion of his first year of college, and only 19 years old, he married. Over the next 14 years, the couple had three daughters together.

During the remaining college years, he worked full-time

as a valet, mostly for the Wine Cellar and Lobster Pot

restaurants in Redington Beach. In March 1986, his oldest daughter, Kelsey, arrived about two months before his USF graduation. His family continued to grow, with the birth of Cara, in March 1991, and Hanne, in December 1997.

About twenty years ago, Bjorn's family doubled in size when he married his current wife, Denise, who had a daughter, Heidi, and sons Zach and Ben. The family continues to

grow with grandchildren, spouses and significant others.

It was at the early age of about 14, that Bjorn realized he would become a trial attorney. The path to criminal defense was paved during his undergraduate years, while volunteering for a lawyer who represented those condemned to die. His legal career started with the Office of the Public Defender in and for the Sixth Judicial Circuit, which covers Pinellas and Pasco Counties. This gave him a solid foundation as a

early years than most lawyers have in their entire legal careers. Bjorn has

been in private practice with his primary

office in Clearwater, and a satellite office in

also loves to travel throughout the world. A special place in his heart remains in Norway, where much of his family, including his mother, still resides and where many wonderful childhood memories will forever remain.

and being in possession of 3.5 metric tons of cocaine. Bjorn was also able to set the foundation for acquittals in the appellate courts for three clients originally convicted of murder. Two of the clients were sentenced to death and one to life in prison, prior to their acquittal and release. However, the most rewarding aspects of his career have been to be part of the joy surrounding satisfied clients and their families, as well as witnessing their success in life.







I was listening to the television when I heard them speaking about regrowing romaine lettuce from the stem. I thought what a fun experiment to do during the mandatory Stay Home time or even more fun to do if you have children, possibly for a science experiment.

I googled the instructions and here is what I learned from Getty Stewart:

STEPS FOR HOW TO REGROW LETTUCE FROM A STEM

- 1. Eat your purchased lettuce, cutting the leaves at about 1 inch from the bottom.
- 2. Place remaining stem in a shallow dish of water (about 1/2 inch).
- 3. Place on a window sill or under grow lights.
- 4. Change water in bowl every 1 to 2 days.
- 5. Watch your lettuce grow. It is truly remarkable how quickly the new shoots start. You'll also notice that roots will start to grow on the bottom.
- 6. After 10-12 days, your lettuce is going to be as big as it will likely ever get. No, it's not going to be a full head of lettuce, it'll be just enough to top a sandwich or make a small salad. But how cool is that!

If you leave your lettuce beyond this point, it will become spindly and bitter as it attempts to produce seed. It won't be pleasant to eat at this point. You'll know it has reached this point when the leaves start turning a blue green color and/or the main stalk shoots up and leaves become less dense.

PROTECT THE MEN IN OUR LIVES FROM THE #1 Killer in America

Prescription Pad or Fork-Choose Your Weapon

Ahhh, June. Summer picnics, backyard grilling, and Father's Day all put family – especially Dads – at the top of our minds. Which is why protecting the men in our lives from the number one killer in America – responsible for nearly 650 thousand deaths each year – is so important. The culprit is coronary heart disease (CHD), and in truth, it strikes only slightly fewer women than men. The fact is, it's indiscriminate in its killing.

To understand how we can fight heart disease, it helps to know that the atherosclerosis (plaque buildups in the coronary arteries) that causes CHD appears years – even decades – before it becomes a diagnosed problem. In fact, studies have shown that fatty streaks, the precursor to atherosclerosis, appear in the arteries of nearly all-American children by the time they are ten. By the time we are in our 20s and 30s, the plaques have begun to harden, and disease is setting in, and by our 40s and 50s, it is killing us. And it all starts with cholesterol. Specifically, elevated LDL levels in your blood. In fact, cholesterol is the one

So, what's the fix?

Medication is the generally favored route, because it's easy (just pop a pill!), and because it follows the prevailing wisdom that prescription meds are the surest path to health. That's why cholesterol-lowering statins like Lipitor are the most-prescribed class of drugs in the U.S, with more than 35 million people taking them daily. They do an excellent job of lowering LDL cholesterol, but not without risk – they can increase risk of diabetes and can also have brain-related side effects like memory loss and confusion. In addition, long-term use can increase risk of prostate, bladder, and invasive breast cancer.

If the idea of a lifetime of medication sounds just fine to you, statins could be your best bet. But there is another way to protect yourself and your loved ones from heart disease – one that also has side effects, but of an entirely different sort: namely, reduced risk of cancer and diabetes, and protection of the liver and brain. It works quickly and just as effectively as statins, and it can start with your next meal.

It's true - you can drastically reduce your LDL levels with diet alone by reducing your intake of three things:

- trans fat found in processed foods, meat, and dairy
- saturated fat found in animal products and junk foods
- $\mbox{\ensuremath{\bullet}}$ dietary cholesterol found primarily in animal-derived foods, especially eggs

Yep, the processed junk food and animal products that dominate the standard American diet are the number one contributor to bad cholesterol. A whole food plant-based diet corrects that. To be sure, adopting a plant-based lifestyle requires some effort up front and a period of adjustment. But when the payoff is a healthy heart and a longer, disease-free life for everyone in your family – without daily medication – the choice becomes quite clear.







I do not know when I'll be able to travel again. The memories of seeing friends and family along those trips are helping me get through these tough times of being confined at home.


So, what is my point? My point is, that when the world reopens again, it is going to be that much more important to seize the day. Or in the case of travel, **take the trip**!





Indoor Air Quality Starts with Your AC System

Indoor Air Quality starts at your AC system

People spend about 90% of their lives indoors, and pollutant levels can be as high as 100 times the levels encountered outside. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) ranks indoor air pollution among the top four environmental hazards in America.

While we have our attention focused on the spread of Coronavirus, and we are thinking about the necessary precautions that are needed to reduce our chances of coming in contact with this virus, HVAC professionals know that Coronavirus is not the only disease, germ, virus, or pollutant we need to combat in our homes. We also need to consider the other viruses and germs that are spread through a central HVAC system. Scientists believe the principal transmission mode of the Coronavirus is by respiratory droplets, which may travel several feet from someone who is coughing or sneezing. Covering your mouth when you cough or sneeze is the first step to control the spread. However, residual contaminants can travel through your HVAC system, where all air in the home is circulated and can contribute to the spread of an airborne virus. The Coronavirus has the same traits as other viruses such as the common cold, the flu, and a sore throat, by how it is spread from person-to-person.

Source control is always the first step when dealing with IAQ concerns such as mold, dust, odors, and even viruses. There are many remedies when it comes to managing IAQ in a home. Some products range from a higher Minimum Efficiency Reporting Value (MERV) rated filter, electronic air cleaners, and ultra-violet sterilization systems. The HVAC system and duct system can contribute to spreading unwanted pathogens in the air, not because your system came contaminated from the factory, but because the air in your home became contaminated.

Tiny pathogens spread in the air can be fungi, bacteria, or viruses. The difference between a virus and bacteria is viruses are much smaller than bacteria, and viruses cannot survive without a host. According to the Mayo Clinic, fewer than 1% of bacteria cause disease in people.

In addition to spreading viruses through an HVAC system, another nemesis is mold, a biological growth. Mold is, in the simplest terms, part of the "dust to dust" program. Everything living will die, it will return to the food chain, whether it's a mighty oak

tree, your favorite leather shoes (once upon a time, a cow), or that forgotten orange in the back of the refrigerator.


Your HVAC system can provide biological growth the perfect opportunity to form and grow. There are three things needed to support biological growth. Food is the number one source of supporting biological growth. One example of food sources is skin cells that have flaked off and floated into the HVAC system. The next item to support organic growth is moisture. Once those skin cells made it through the system, they can become attached to the evaporator coil or blower motor. When the coil starts to produce condensation along with the food source, it becomes the perfect recipe for biological growth. The final item to contribute to organic growth is the absence of ultraviolet light. HVAC professionals and homeowners who manage these factors, reduce the risk of biological growth.

To set the record straight:

- 1. Mold and viruses are not a factory option
- 2. AC units do not create mold or viruses

When an ultra-violet system is used correctly and installed to the manufacture's guidelines, it can prove to be a useful tool. Ultra-violet exists in natural sunlight (it's why we wear sunscreen, and mold grows under a rock), it disassembles the DNA





of organics. It reduces them to nitrogen and oxygen. Ultra-violet is most effective as surface irradiation (with a limited "kill zone") and is used in many applications. It is used to sterilize medical instruments, clean reclaimed water in treatment plants, saltwater aquariums, and is used in food processing.

HBL- What inspired you to become a Firefighter?

sc-My father was a police officer and was also in the military. Growing up, I spend a lot of time visiting him at the police station, and occasionally, he would also take me to the fire stations. ble for staffing/scheduling for my shift, evaluations of personnel, and oversight of Largo's branch of the Pinellas County Technical Rescue team.

HBL- Do you have an safety advice for our residents?

SC-Make sure your smoke detectors are in good working order, as they definitely save lives.

HBL- Tell us about your family.

SC- My wife Angie and I have lived on Bamboo Lane since October 2016. We have a daughter who was born on September 2, 2019, and she is our whole world. Angie is finishing nursing school and plans to become a Nurse Practitioner. We plan on having one, possibly two more children, in the near future. Both of our families are close (Largo and Seminole) so we spend a lot of time together, which we are grateful for and enjoy.





Start Up Your Stay-at-Home Job

Resident Tammy Staveley Explains On-Line Selling

Hi, I'm your neighbor, Tammy Staveley, on Palmetto Lane. I was a stayat-home Mom, working with my husband in real estate, when the industry crashed in the 2008 recession. I began selling items on eBay as a way to bolster our income during this period. My daughter was the main reason I turned to online buying. She had lost her favorite "can't sleep without it" blanket. You parents know what a disastrous situation that can be. I began searching for a replacement blanket online, and then decided to sell items, with a focus mainly on children's blankets and stuffed animals.

After I became an eBay seller, I received emails from mothers everywhere, thanking me for their purchases. It was a rewarding experience and was also helping me feed my own family. In time, what had been a small part-time gig turned into a real full-time job. I still am selling online and have added many different items to keep up with market demands and trends.



Working from home is a blessing, especially during the stay at home coronavirus pandemic. I can enjoy activities with my children while still making some money. I want to share what I have learned about selling online with my neighbors. This is a scary time for most of us. And some of you might want a new stay-at-home job or may need the extra income. It is amazing how much stuff we all have lying around our homes that we no longer want or use that others might buy.

I want to reach out and help my Harbor Bluff neighbors with the knowledge I have gained over the past decade of online selling. This is just a small portion of what I know. The possibilities are endless for the world of online selling.

If you are considering selling an item on eBay, you will need to create an eBay account. You do not need to open a store, just an account. You will have limitations, such as only being able to list 10 items or a total of \$1,000 in merchandise value. After you get started, you can ask eBay to raise these limits. You no longer need to open a PayPal account, as you can link your bank account directly to eBay for payments.

What do you list? Pick the items that are in high demand and will sell quickly. Look around your house for things that are in demand and are fast sellers. For example, cell phones, camera items, and video games. When you are researching the items, look online under sold items. This will be the best way to get a going rate.

There are two ways to list an item.

The first one is Buy It Now. This will be a set price. The second way is at auction. Buy It Now may take longer when you are first starting out. But if you do research on previously sold items, you can list your item at the average sold price, or a bit lower, so that it will sell faster. Make sure you are looking at the sold items, not active, and be sure to watch for new or used condition. Then look for active listings to see what price other sellers have placed on the same item.

If running an auction, you will need to start the price low to draw in buyers' attention. I suggest you run a 7- day auction as that gives the item more time to get bids. You are taking the risk that it may sell for the starting price, so do not list at auction unless you are willing to let the item go for the starting price. Once an item sells and is paid for, you must follow through and ship the item.

If you are selling used, describe the item thoroughly, listing all flaws. Try to fit your items into a few categories.

You are a new seller, so you will have no feedback. Buyers look to feedback to determine your reputation, and if it warrants a higher price, and for assurance that you are a trusted seller. There are a few ways to get feedback. One way to get the much-needed feedback is to make a purchase. Buy some shipping supplies that you will need; and be sure to buy from a large seller with a good reputation as they will list your feedback automatically. Be sure you pay immediately as this raises your chances of getting good feedback.

Another way to receive excellent feedback is to describe your item accurately and take very good pictures. Be sure to photograph every flaw. Using a white background is best and suggested by eBay. Upload the eBay app and then use your cell phone to take the picture. This is an easy process. You can buy inexpensive white foam boards for background at Dollar Tree.

Natural sunlight is the best lighting, so outside is OK, or inside by a large window. Shipping is the last step. Keep it simple at first. Make sure that shipping is quick; using one-day shipping is best. You can put a handwritten thank you note inside the package; this will also help you get feedback. The note can simply say "thank-you for your order." This will let the buyer know you are an actual person, not a large corporation.

One helpful tip is to use USPS approved supplies. These can be ordered for free on usps.com and include priority boxes and bags. Poly bags are great for shipping non-breakables and any item under 16-ounces. Ebay suggests free shipping, so you will need to add the cost into the price of the item. When you are researching prices, be sure to check out shipping costs to get a good idea how much this fee will be. You can also use the usps.com website to get a quote on shipping fees. But, again, do not forget to add to the price of an item if offering free shipping. You want to be making money, not losing it.


Amazon is a whole different site altogether. If you are purchasing large quantities and have invoices, you may want to go this route. You can open a seller account. They will require invoices on your purchases from products. And you will need these invoices to apply to be ungated in many different categories.

There are two main ways to sell on Amazon. One is FBA, or Full-filled by Amazon, which is where you list and package an item. Then you send it into an Amazon warehouse. Once there, the listing will go live for sale. Amazon will store your items and ship out when they sell. There are storage fees, and many selling fees

involved. Depending on the products you offer, storage fees are determined by size. Currently there is a hold on sending in products, allowing for only essential items due to the COVID-19 virus.

The other option is Merchant Filled. This is where you will store the item, and ship when it sells. You can open your account and click "sell an item," then find the item from the Amazon database. You can input the barcode, or scan if using a cell phone for listing. Then be sure to read the description. as you will need to have the exact item. When listing on Amazon, you do not need to add photographs. However, if an item is used, it is helpful to add a current picture.

You also can add a product not currently listed in the Amazon catalog. If doing this, you will be required to fill in many details and add photos. Amazon requires a lot of ungating in certain categories. And some are off limits to most everyone. Gating means that you must provide invoices and receipts from suppliers in order to see those items.



There are many other sites for online selling. A few are: Mercari, Bonanza, Real Real, Poshmark, Etsy, Grailed, Tradesy, Facebook, and Depop.

Whichever site you use will depend on the specific merchandise you have to sell.

Etsy is great for handmade and vintage

Mercari is great for everyday around-the-house items and is more like a yard sale site.

Bonanza is similar to eBay for items that are in high demand.

Real Real is perfect for luxury consignment and designer brands.

Grailed is a site for high end men's clothing and designer brands.

Poshmark and Depop are both marketplace sites for fashion.

Facebook is perfect for large items that would be hard to ship and items that can be sold locally.



Some people shine brightest during the darkest times. And times are pretty dark at the moment, which is why community leaders and groups are banding together to help those in need.

The ripple effects of the coronavirus pandemic have been felt by individuals, families and businesses throughout Pinellas County and around the world, so people are doing whatever they can to make a difference.

For instance, Chris Scott, owner of Belleair Market on Indian Rocks Road, could be seen outside his store March 27 unloading several pallets of fresh produce into an RCS Food Bank truck.

"Sysco Foods came to me and said, 'Hey, we've got all this extra produce, what can you take at deep discounts?" Scott said.

He didn't need all the food for his store, but saw that Devin Pappas, publisher of Harbor Bluffs Living magazine, was seeking food donations for RCS via social media. He called her and she said they'll take whatever he can get them.

So, he bought 2½ pallets of produce, potatoes and fruit, and donated it all to the food bank.

"So, now we have some people who are going to be able to eat,"

The donation is welcomed, because RCS supports more than 75 community food pantries, serving more than 130,000 individuals each year.

Kirk Ray Smith, RCS president and CEO, said the nonprofit is now facing an increased demand with dwindling supplies.

"We've seen a decrease in what our retail partners are able to provide," Smith said. "One of the ways we address food insecurity is we have relationships with several grocers. They give surplus to us and give us discounts on additional (items) we purchase from them. This panic buying is having a ripple effect on us. They no longer have surplus. It's down 80 percent pre-coronavirus."

UPDATE- A week after that article was written, Sysco West Coast Florida donated almost 3,500 pounds of fresh food items to RCS. This donation alone equates to feeding about 750 individuals within our community!


